Following is a list of key dates and deadlines remaining in this year's election process.

- *March 15.* The Board's approved list of candidates is sent to members.
- April 8. Deadline for at-large candidate to submit self-nomination petitions, complete with 10 supporting signatures, to the Office.
- April 26. OLLI Annual Meeting. Each candidate will be allowed 2-3 minutes to address the group.
- April 26 May 10. Online voting takes place.
- May 13. Results of the election are announced.
