

Lecture: Friday, Oct. 16: The United Nations

The United Nations - Friend or Foe? Superfluous or Necessary? with E. Michael Southwick

Ambassador Southwick served as a US diplomat for 36 years, beginning in 1967. He was Deputy

Chief of Mission at three African posts and was ambassador to Uganda. In Washington, his tours
included a variety of tasks, including cultural exchanges, economics, management, Congressional
relations, intelligence, human rights, and UN affairs, culminating in two assignments as Deputy

Assistant Secretary of State. A strong advocate for economic and political reform including respect
for human rights, he led or participated in numerous US delegations to international conferences. He
was the chief US negotiator for the treaty to ban the use of child soldiers, since signed and ratified by
the US. An advocate for multilateral approaches to world problems, he played a key role in the return
of the United States to UNESCO and in opening the Universal Postal Union to the private sector. His
awards include a Presidential Service Award from President George Bush and a medal from the
government of Niger for helping to organize the successful international response to one of the worst
droughts of the century. Since leaving the State Department, Southwick has worked at a think tank
and has lectured on international affairs.
