Zoom Accessibility

Zoom is beta testing closed captioning for hard of hearing individuals. OLLI at AU is not endorsing any other software, but we do want to share this information with you. Until Zoom offers free closed captioning, there is a voice-to-text workaround that is free and easy to use. Google Live Transcribe shows speech and sound as text on your screen, so you can participate in conversations around you more easily. You can type responses on the screen, get alerted when your name is spoken, and search within transcriptions.

Read more and download the **Google Live Transcribe app (free)** which is **only available for Android cellphone devices**. Simply setup your Android phone adjacent to the sound source (e.g. laptop, desktop or iPad) and the app will transcribe any voice being broadcast. The accuracy is quite reliable with minimal latency. There are various voice-to-text apps for Apple devices but none are currently comparable to the quality of Google Live Transcribe. Therefore, it may be worth your while to buy and use a cheap Android device that is internet-capable for the use of Google Live Transcribe alone.
