# ACADEMIC PROGRAMMING

#### FALL REGISTRATION IS OPEN!

Registration is open on the OLLI website for the fall semester (September 23-December 6). Each course description lists the format and whether the class will be recorded. Courses meet for a varying length of time (see each study group for the number of weeks). The membership fee (\$330 for the semester or \$600 for both fall and spring) allows you to sign up for three courses before the lottery. After the lottery, when you have received your class assignment letter, you can add a fourth study group by logging into your account. **Make sure to register before the fall semester lottery on Friday, September 6.**


# ALLIANCE FOR NEW MUSIC-THEATRE Live & About Fall 2024 Season


#### "MY LIFE IN RECIPES" WITH JOAN NATHAN
