Sunil Félix, Nuclear Energy and Sustainable
Development

March 14 | 1:30 PM

In-Person at OLLI: Room A

Since the first nuclear plant in the 1950s, the world has been divided on the use of nuclear power for energy. Using the case of France, Dr. Sunil Félix will discuss the advantages and disadvantages of nuclear energy and its contribution to sustainable growth of a country. Dr. Félix has been the Nuclear Counsellor at the French Embassy in Washington, DC since 2020, having previously served in the same position at the French Embassies in South Korea, India, and Japan. Following a PhD and postdoctoral studies in Mathematics, he joined the French Alternative Energies and Atomic Energy

Commission (CEA – France) in 1990. Since then, he has been working as a research engineer in the Structural Analysis field. He was also the Personal Assistant to the Chairman of the Generation IV International Forum (GIF), from 2006 to 2010 during the French Presidency of the Forum.

SERENDIPITY TALK

Denise Rose, *Eating for Optimal Brain Health: How to Get Started*Monday, March 24 | 3:30-5:00 PM

Online via Zoom

In this talk you will discover the optimal plant-based foods that evidence-based research suggests you eat every day to strive for optimal brain health. Sociologist Denise Rose will present this talk explaining what these foods are, what serving sizes you should consume daily, and how to make meals out of these brain nourishing foods. This talk is valuable for anyone wanting to prevent and halt brain diseases via lifestyle choices and those new to whole food, plant-based eating (WFPB).

Denise Rose (PhD) is an enthusiastic educator who has been teaching WFPB nutrition classes for several years. She also has a YouTube channel with her husband called Happy Vegan Couple. On their YouTube channel they post WFPB cooking videos to help people learn how to cook delicious, plant-based healthy foods in their own kitchens; Denise also shares long form interviews with people who have transitioned to a plant-based lifestyle and received major health benefits due to their dietary change. Denise led the Fall 2023 OLLI at AU class titled "Eat Plants: Prevent and Reverse Chronic Disease With a Whole Food Plant-Based Lifestyle!"
