Join Mark Stevens, Dan Moskowitz, Gary Eakes, and Larry Gondelman in presenting one or two sessions in our latest collaborative class offering this spring: "What Are the 5 Minutes You'd Play to Make a Friend Fall in Love with Music?"

This course takes inspiration from a *New York Times* feature titled "What Are the 5 Minutes You'd Play to Make a Friend Fall in Love with Music?" In this series, artists, writers, and critics choose a piece of music they believe can make someone fall in love with a particular artist, genre, or theme and then explain what makes that selection so captivating. For example, Patti Smith, John Turturro, and Renée Fleming each selected powerful opera passages to showcase the dramatic allure of the art form. In our course, each class will highlight 3-4 artists, genres, or themes—such as Jazz Vocalists—introducing participants to musical clips and videos that reveal the unique talents of each featured artist. The course aims to introduce participants to styles of music that may be less familiar, encouraging discovery and appreciation. Throughout, we'll explore what makes each artist or genre so distinct and remarkable.

The course is broad in scope, with a primary focus on jazz and classical music. To enrich our sessions with a diverse range of musical perspectives, we're looking to involve multiple presenters with varying tastes and expertise. John Leshy, The Past and Future of America's

John Leshy is Professor Emeritus at the University of California College of the Law in San Francisco. Yale University Press published his comprehensive political history of America's public lands, *Our Common Ground*, in 2022. Leshy was Solicitor of the Interior Department throughout the Clinton Administration, and earlier served as special counsel to the Chair of the Natural Resources Committee of the US House of Representatives, a

law professor at Arizona State University, Associate Solicitor of Interior for Energy and Resources in the Carter Administration, an attorney-advocate with the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), and a litigator in the US Department of Justice Civil Rights Division.

Murry Sidlin is President and Artistic Director of The Defiant Requiem Foundation and creator of the concert-dramas Defiant Requiem: Verdi at Terezín and Hours of Freedom: The Story of the Terezín Composer, and the play The Verdi Verdict (Mass Appeal, 1943). He lectures extensively on the arts and humanities as practiced by the prisoners in the Theresienstadt (Terezín) Concentration Camp. Mr. Sidlin has been a conductor or artistic director of the Baltimore Symphony, the National Symphony Orchestra, the New Haven and Long Beach (California) Symphonies, the Tulsa Philharmonic, the Connecticut Ballet, the Cascade Festival of Music in Bend, Oregon, and the San Diego Symphony. He led 18 consecutive New Year's Eve Gala concerts at the Kennedy Center with the National Symphony Orchestra. He was Dean of the School of Music at Catholic University where he still serves as Professor of Conducting and Instrumental Music.

But laughter has the power to build bonds, forge trust, and improve productivity, even in the most challenging of times. Yet many of us are uncomfortable with letting go and connecting at the most human level. From physical and emotional benefits, laughter is essential. This session will engage attendees with the latest science supporting humor and the impact it can have on our lives and those for whom we care.

Professor Malone is the Director, Key Executive Leadership Programs at
American University. He is a frequent guest lecturer on kindness, gratitude,
emotional intelligence, compassion, ethics, mindfulness, and leadership at
various organizations, professional associations, and universities including the
Fulbright Scholars Program. His research and teaching interests include human
motivation, kindness, leadership, ethics, and organizational behavior. Dr. Malone
is a retired Navy Captain. While in the Navy, he served in a number of
leadership and policy roles including as a professor of biometrics and preventive
medicine at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences; Academic
Director; and Dean of Academics for Navy Medicine.




Antisemitism and its Dynamics During Pandemics and Public Health Crises with Dr. Robert Williams

Monday, November 4 | 4:00 PM | Registration Required

Dr. Robert J. Williams, who received his PhD from American University, is the Finci-Viterbi Executive Director of the USC Shoah Foundation, the UNESCO Chair on Antisemitism and Holocaust Research, and the Advisor to the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance.

The lecture will cover the forms of antisemitism that link to rhetoric on disease and how they serve as particularly effective forms of propaganda that can radicalize communities, lead to social tensions, and inform types of anti-Jewish violence. The justifications for such false linkages have varied over time. Antisemitic themes of disease, contagion, pestilence, and parasitism play upon unconscious fears, making antisemitic claims more insidious and akin to unseen threats to the health and well-being of individuals and their communities.
