The Man Ray Project: Caesar & The Mannequin

Alliance for New Music-Theatre premieres *The Man Ray Project: Caesar & The Mannequin*, a multi-media original work of music-theatre. Follow the creative team of Composer Andrew E. Simpson and Librettist Susan Galbraith, Artistic Director of Alliance for New Music-Theatre, down a Man Ray rabbit hole to an illogical world where simmering conflicts escalate between political power and the power of art; between man, woman, and Wo-Man; between truth and alternative fiction. All the characters score points as each in turn wields violence, mockery, and subjugation against the others, while the artist tries desperately to make sense of it all.

When Caesar sings, "You can't stick me in a closet; I will not stay there," the work reveals that such a Caesar is prescient and dangerously relevant today as we careen into election season. Does it mean the end of the Republic?

Voted as audience choice for IN Series' 2019-20 season, this circus version of Rigoletto, complete with a circus band and bawdy new English text by Bari Biern, became a victim of COVID-19, but before that, victim to 19th-century censors that found its exploration of the misdeeds of the powerful too dangerous for the public eye. At once darkly devilish, toe-tappingly infectious, and horrifically funny, Verdi's masterpiece is made intimate, in-your-face, and inescapably enjoyable under the big top, with a cast of fan favorites returning from IN Series' 2023 production "The Promised End," and led once more by Emily Baltzer.
