Madame Fourcade's Secret War: The Daring Young Woman Who Led France's Largest Spy Network Against the Nazis

Lynne Olson is a *New York Times* bestselling author of eight books on history, most of which deal in some way with World War II and Britain's crucial role in that conflict. Former US Secretary of State Madeleine Albright has called her "our era's foremost chronicler of World War II politics and diplomacy." Lynne's latest book, *Madame Fourcade's Secret War: The Daring Young Woman Who Led France's Largest Spy Network Against the Nazis*, was published by Random House in March 2019. It was an immediate *New York Times* bestseller, as were two of her earlier books, *Those Angry Days: Roosevelt, Lindbergh, and America's Fight Over World War II, 1939-1941*, and *Citizens of London: The*

Americans Who Stood with Britain in Its Darkest, Finest Hour. Before becoming a full-time author, she worked as a journalist for ten years, first with the Associated Press and then the *Baltimore Sun*, where she covered national politics and eventually the White House. Lynne lives in Washington, DC with her husband, Stanley Cloud, with whom she co-authored two books.


