Restaurants and Community During the Pandemic and Beyond
"Chef Geoff" Tracy
Friday, October 8

1:30 PM (via Zoom)

After graduating first in his class at the Culinary Institute of America, Geoff opened the original Chef Geoff's in 2000 followed by three other restaurants, including Lia's in Friendship Heights. Chef Geoff also provides food service for the Jesuit Residence at Georgetown University. He is the co-author of the *New York Times* best seller, *Baby Love: Healthy, Easy, Delicious Meals for Your Baby and Toddler*. Geoff has served as chairman of the executive board of the Restaurant Association of Metropolitan Washington. Additionally, Chef Geoff's has contributed to hundreds of charities and local schools in the form of silent auctions and fundraising. In 2014, Geoff cooked in the White House as part of the First Lady's "Let's Move" initiative. In 2019, Geoff became the ambassador for La Cocina, a local organization with a mission to create opportunities for social and economic change through education empowerment, and culinary training. He has received numerous local and national awards including the Albert Uster "Chef of the Year" award.

## October 7 Serendipity Talk

How to Steal Priceless French Art

When German troops invaded France in 1940, they planned to seize fabulous French-owned art for Hitler's planned National Museum in Linz and wound up with about 8,000 pictures, much "free," (that is, looted). When the Wehrmacht, the traditional armed forces, refused to transport loot from France before a direct order from Hitler, Hermann Göring helped the official Plunder Committee (called the ERR, Einsatzstab Reichsleiter Rosenberg) with the use of his private train car and seized art "Beyond the Dreams of Avarice," much from Jewish art dealers and art collectors. The Vichy French government grabbed as much as they could before the Germans could get it. And the French person, with absent Jewish neighbors, also often joined the looting. Author Helen Schwartz, OLLI favorite in DC and Saratoga, will use true-life examples from the historical record fictionalized in her historical thriller *Thieves of Paris*.

## October 14 Serendipity Talk

You Are Not American: Citizenship Stripping from Dred Scott to the Dreamers

We think of our citizenship as immutable—as much a part of our identity as our height or eye color. But as law professor Amanda Frost has discovered, the US government regularly revoked citizenship to suppress dissent and deny civil rights to all considered "un-American." Women who married

noncitizens, persecuted racial groups, labor leaders, and political activists were all stripped of their citizenship, and sometimes deported, by a government who denied their membership in "We the People." Drawing on the narratives of those who lost their citizenship and fought to get it back, Frost will describe a hidden history of discrimination and xenophobia that continues to this day.

Amand Frost is the Bronfman Distinguished Professor Law and Government at American University, where she writes and teaches in the fields of constitutional, immigration, and citizenship law. Her recently-published book *You Are Not American: Citizenship Stripping from Dred Scott to the Dreamers* was listed by the New York Times book review as a "New & Noteworthy" book. In addition to her academic writing, she frequently publishes in mainstream publications such as *The Atlantic, The Washington Post, The New York Times, The New Republic, Slate,* and *The American Prospect*.
